## Two City Programs Provide Multiple Informational Opportunities



The Sedalia Fire and Police Departments both started two programs in September; the Firefighter I and II Course for the SFD and the Citizen Police Academy for the SPD.

Being able to take the necessary time off to attend firefighter training is difficult if you're trying to maintain a job and meet responsibilities. The Sedalia Fire Department started their Firefighter 1 and II classes with that in mind, providing classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 p.m. to 10 p.m. and every other Saturday from 8:00 a.m. from 5:00 p.m. Another roadblock for many of those interested in a fire service career is the cost of tuition. The Sedalia Fire Department has been able to keep their student expenses as low as possible with tuition costs at approximately \$1,200.



The 2015 Firefighter I and II class started on September 15, 2015. There are currently 15 students participating in this course.

While there is no guarantee each student will pass the Missouri state testing to become a firefighter or that it will secure them a position with the Sedalia Fire Department or any other fire service provider, the content within the course provides the best preparatory tools available to test for Missouri State Firefighter I, Firefighter II, Hazmat Awareness and Hazmat Operations certificates.

On Saturday, September 26, Instructor Daniel Shaw started the morning showing the class how to create the figure 8 knot (pictured below, left). This knot is very important as it is a building block for several other knots. Once outside, the class was able to put on all their gear as a class for the first time, from boots to helmet and gloves.

The State of Missouri requires a firefighter to be able to don his/her entire gear within 90 seconds; the Sedalia Fire Department requires them to be ready within 60 seconds. Instructor Shaw explained that even if you get a call in the early hours of the morning, you will be able to properly and safely assemble your gear as quickly as possible. Later, the class participated in their first skills set training.

The Sedalia Police Department has started the Citizen Police Academy as a way for the community to learn about the process behind the procedures and why it is important to have such procedures in place.



The Citizen Police Academy began on September 8, 2015 and they currently have 19 members in attendance. Classes are held every Tuesday evening from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. for a duration of ten weeks. Participants are able to interact with many of the law enforcement officers they might meet here in Sedalia.

On the evening of September 29, 2015, Sgt. Detective Joshua Howell talked about the Police Department staff composition within the Criminal Investigations Bureau. There are

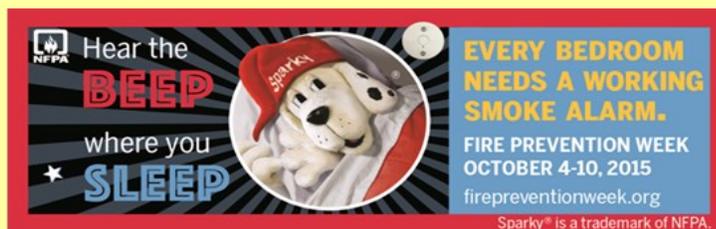
two full-time detectives, two rotating detectives and one Community Policing officer who work with Sgt. Detective Howell and they all report to their Criminal Investigations Bureau Commander. The Criminal Investigations Bureau Commander reports directly to the Chief of Police. The Criminal Investigations Bureau is responsible for investigations, community policing, property and evidence and Internal Affairs complaints.

With essentially a four person team investigating all the cases for Sedalia, Sgt. Detective Howell explained how the Criminal Investigations Bureau determines the solvability of each case. This process helps the Criminal Investigations Bureau investigate the cases in the most timely and efficient manner possible. Later that evening, the Citizen Police Academy got to learn about the fingerprinting process.



Some of the previous classes included learning about Use of Force and it was emphasized using the laser shot system. There are many new and interesting subjects planned for the Academy over the next few weeks.

With the enthusiastic attendance reported at both the Sedalia Firefighter Training and the Citizen Police Academy, both the Fire and Police Departments plan on offering these programs again.



## City Observes Fire Prevention Week

On Friday, October 2, 2015, Mayor Stephen Galliher was joined by members of the Sedalia Fire Department to proclaim October 4-October 10, 2015, "Fire Prevention Week" in the City of Sedalia. This year's theme is, "Hear the Beep Where You Sleep —Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm."
