October is Fire Prevention Month and this year's theme is "Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Batteries in Your Home." Fire Prevention week will be observed October 5 - 11, 2025.

This year's focus is on lithium-ion batteries, which power many of the devices we rely on every day. When handled improperly, these batteries can overheat, catch fire, or even explode.

To help keep our community safe, the NFPA (National Fire Prevention Association) has shared important guidelines for handling these batteries. In addition to the guidelines listed below, you can explore the NFPA's website, which features FAQ's and other resources to help you learn more about fire safety.

Buy only listed products.
 Only purchase devices and batteries that are listed by a nationally recognized testing laboratory (such as UL).

- Charge devices safely. Use the manufacturer's charger, avoid, charging on beds, or couches, and never leave devices plugged in unattended overnight.

 Unplug it or remove when it's fully charged.
- Recycle batteries responsibly. Do not throw lithium-ion batteries in the trash. Take them to a proper drop-off or recycling center for safe disposal.

The Sedalia Fire Department and all City personnel are committed to promoting fire prevention and public safety year-round. This October, let's work together, to reduce risks in our homes and keep our community safe.

HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

Make sure that drivers can see your child.

 Consider choosing costumes made of light coloured materials or placing reflective tape on the front and back of costumes.

2. Make sure that your child can see cars and traffic.

Consider avoiding costumes with masks or hoods that can obscure their vision.

3. Discuss traffic safety with your child prior to heading out for the night.

- Only cross the street at marked crosswalks and when traffic signals allow.
- Don't dart out from between parked cars.

4. When driving on Halloween, be aware.

- Children may be hard to see in dark costumes and may dart out from between parked cars or cross in the middle of the street.
- Drive slowly and be prepared to stop.

Reduce trip or slip hazards by ensuring that your child's costume fits properly.

Consider the fit of footwear and the length of items such as capes.

6. Reduce hazards for trick-or-treaters coming to your home.

- Consider illuminating sidewalks and pathways to ensure good visibility.
- Consider reducing, securing or removing potential trip hazards such as unsecured power cords, wet leaves, snow or ice.

7. Sort through treats with your child.

- Be aware that gum and hard candies can be a choking hazard.
- Discard unwrapped candies or candies with a torn or unsealed wrapper.
