Re: Agenda items for City Council meeting on Monday, May 20, 2024, 6:30 p.m.

<u>Public Hearing For Liahona West LLC Annexation Petition</u> — A petition was received for annexation of property owned by Liahona West, LLC along 12th Street at the West edge of town. In accordance with State Statutes, we must hold a public hearing between 14 and 60 days of receiving such a petition. The hearing is to hear from any interested parties on the appropriateness of the annexation. We must then wait at least 14 days after the hearing to consider adoption of an ordinance to conclude the annexation.

<u>Community Development Committee</u> – There are two items for consideration through the Community Development Committee.

- 1. The City has created a special business district as authorized under state statutes. In order to advise Council on the appropriateness of the ad valorem taxes within the district and the use of such revenues, an advisory board was established. In accordance with the current code of ordinances, the Central Business and Cultural District Board of Directors shall make an annual report to Council in May of each year. Such report is to include the board's recommendation on the continuation of the special levy placed upon the property within the district and recommendations for public improvements for the upcoming fiscal year planning. The current tax levy authorized is 85 cents per \$100 assessed valuation.
- 2. At the last meeting, a public hearing was held to hear comments about the appropriateness of an annexation petition for property owned by E.W. Thompson, Inc. and being transferred to Pettis County Ambulance District to construct another ambulance base station. During the hearing Director Simmons presented the petition and Diane Simon provided background on behalf of the petitioners and offered to answer any questions. No comments have been received since the meeting. Now that the required time period since the hearing has passed, Council can consider an ordinance to annex the property into the City. Staff recommends approval.

<u>Finance/Administration Committee</u> – There are two items for consideration through the Finance / Administration Committee.

- Finance Director Pyle will provide an update on major tax collection trends.
- Councilman Oldham requested, through a motion that was passed by Council at the April 15
 meeting, for staff to present a policy that would allow for employees of the City to be compensated for time off to perform volunteer work. Director Ramey-Trull will give a presentation on this concept with options for Council to consider.

<u>Public Works Committee</u> – There are six items for consideration through the Public Works Committee.

- 1. Included in strategic planning and budget development process was a customer service enhancement tool to read the Radio-Frequency Identification (RFID) of trash carts. The existing carts have RFID tracking devices in them, however, the scanning equipment was not purchased at the time of implementation. The scanners will allow for better tracking to quickly identify missed pickups and other issues, as well as, route tracking to provide more information for customers. Also, the scanners will assist us in moving to a more volume-based trash service, which is instrumental to devising a recycling program based on cost drivers. Staff recommends approval of the purchase.
- 2. As discussed last fiscal year, staff proposed and Council agreed that we should move to a uniform Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system to help us manage our water and sewer systems. This system of sensors, alarms, and software track data about the operations of these essential services to notify and provide analytical data to staff on these functions. The water system has used a SCADA system developed by MicroComm, Inc. for several years, and has recently upgraded to the newest version. This system is an off the shelf product that is sold to many other utilities and user customizable to fit our specific needs. The sewer system on the other hand uses a proprietary SCADA system developed by the engineers that designed the 2010 update project. This system is not user friendly and can only be changed by the engineering firm that wrote it. Therefore, Council authorized moving all the SCADA systems to the MicroComm product. However, when we were building the budget for this fiscal year, staff missed rolling the budget forward for the implementation.
- 3. As discussed during the August 21, 2023 Council meeting, the City has partnered with the Lion's Club on several past successful projects, such as a shelter at Katy Park, the Mini Park along Clarendon, and the beautification of the roundabout and the addition of the flag pole, to name just a few. Likewise, this very active club organizes volunteers on a regular basis to pick up trash along 50 Hwy entering our City. In keeping with these great works, the Club approached the City about the possibilities of organizing a fund-raising campaign to facilitate adding logos to the water tower(s). They received an estimated cost of approximately \$40,000 per side to affix the Sedalia logo and tagline to a tower. As you will recall, during the branding campaign, it was stated as a primary goal to create a brand identity for the whole community, and thereby it was not merely about creating a logo for city government. Therefore, it would be entirely appropriate to use the logo and tagline in this way. Likewise, having community support through the civic organizations serves to greatly enhance the sentiment of community spirit and pride displaying this logo represents. The Lions Club agreed to lead the effort to reach out to local service organizations, community clubs, and foundations with an ambitious yet achievable goal of raising \$40,000 and asked for a pledge from the City to match this with \$40,000 that would fund putting the logo on two sides of the West water tower. Council adopted a resolution and budget amendment at the August 21, 2023 meeting pledging support of this effort, directing staff to collaborate with stakeholders, and designating up to \$40,000 matching funds. With this support in hand and the leadership from the Lions Club and many other civic organizations, the community stepped up and raised \$40,700 of restricted donations to this cause. Staff then solicited bids for the application of these logos. The low bid for applying the two logos to the West tower came in well under the estimate the goal was based on at \$23,000. After reviewing this with the leaders of the fundraising campaign, they agreed that additional logos would be the best way to comply with the donor intent and commitments made during the campaign. Further, that with the focus being on

the West tower, and reviewing the angles it could be seen from, it would be desirable to have the logo on three sides. Then to follow up on what was represented to the donors that we would try to also have the logo applied to the downtown tower. Therefore, staff approached the low bidder to negotiate a price to add another logo on the West tower and two sides the downtown tower. The vendor quoted a price of \$57,500 to apply the logo and tagline on all five locations. With this price, that left only \$16,800, much less than the original \$40,000 commitment. Still, the leaders of the fundraising campaign and staff believe that this would satisfy the donor intent and restricted donation conditions. Council at the last meeting voted down the use of public funds to this commitment. Hearing of this, Russell and Julie Childers stepped up and pledged the remaining \$16,800 to fund this entire project out of 100% restricted donations from the community. Since no public dollars will be used now, the question before Council is to approve the contract in accordance with the procurement policies. The low bidder regularly does water tower work, and has successfully performed work for the City in the past. Staff recommends award of the contract to Viking Painting, LLC.

- 4. For the last few years, the City has required any properties outside the City limits that wanted to hook up to City Water and / or Sewer that they would have to agree to annex at such time the property becomes contiguous. Premier Homes LLC owns property at 2630 James Lane and wish to connect to the City water utility. Therefore, staff has negotiated an annexation agreement and recommends approval.
- 5. As presented in the strategic plan, we continue to work through the storm water improvement master plan. We have been able to pick off a project or two each year as available funding has allowed. For this fiscal year, we were successful in securing a grant to accelerate the plan. Council approved contracts for four project areas in February. Staff has worked to secure bids for remaining four project areas within the grant and recommends award of the projects to the lowest / best bidder for each.
- 6. The Citizens Traffic Advisory Commission, with staff assistance, reviewed a request from a citizen to install stop signs at the intersection of 7th Street and Beacon. Of note, there was a similar request received for stop signs at this intersection in October of 2022. Updated traffic counts were captured and accident data was reviewed. The data was compared to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devises (MUTCD) criteria in relation to installing multiway stop signs. The MUTCD criteria includes looking to crash data, vehicle traffic volumes, and speeds of the vehicles passing through the intersection. None of the MUTCD criteria established for guidance in this area were met. This minimum criteria is based on past analysis of traffic patterns and human behavior that indicates the over use of traffic control devises, including stop signs, actually creates more dangerous conditions. Therefore, staff recommended and the Commission voted in concurrence that the request should be denied. Note that after the meeting of the commission and the development of the recommendation, I understand there was an accident at this intersection. Therefore, Councilman Robinson has asked the Commission to review their recommendation.

<u>Public Safety Committee</u> – There are two items for consideration through the Public Safety Committee.

As Fire Chief Irwin presented in his strategic plan, with the long lead times for fire apparatuses, we would need to order a replacement pumper engine now to have it in time to meet the minimum standards published by the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA). This item was

ranked as the 2nd highest priority for capital improvement funding by Council during the strategic planning session. Therefore, One Million Dollars is included in the appropriations for this fiscal year. Chief Irwin and his staff have negotiated the options that best suit our needs and a corresponding price for such an engine within this budget at \$991,205. The estimated lead time for delivery is 800 days. Staff recommends placing the order with Feld Fire Equipment under the HGAC cooperative purchasing arrangement.

2. Police Chief Woolery presented in his strategic plan projects to add license plate recognition (LPR) cameras and software, along with other cameras capable of 360-degree views over areas that have had a significant amount of criminal activity. These pieces of equipment will be great tools to flush out and track down criminals, as well as, provide opportunities to collaborate with other law enforcement agencies nationwide to bring to justice those perpetrators of crime running and hiding from other jurisdictions. These items were priority ranked number 1 and 2 respectively by Council in your strategic planning session. Thereby a total of \$130,000 was appropriated to implement these projects. Staff recommends the purchase of \$94,600 of this equipment at this time.

Presentation: Bowling Alley and Aquatic Facility

Park Director Amy Epple presented information on the Bowling Alley and Aquatic Facility projects.

Park Director Epple stated that engineers were brought in to evaluate Liberty and Centennial pools. In Spring 2018, \$250,000.00 was invested in Liberty Pool to extend the life 5-10 more years. In 2019, it was determined that Centennial pool exceeded the limit to repair and the costs would exceed \$500,000.00. The Park department didn't feel that was prudent use of tax dollars and started the search for a new Aquatic site to consolidate both pools into 1 location due to affordability. The Board wanted the facility to be located on the East Side and the former Sutherland's property is an excellent location for an Aquatic Facility.

In September of 2023 the New Aquatic center location announcement was made and it was stated that "something else was also in the works". Plans are progressing for "Memory Lanes" Bowling Alley due to a generous donation by Sue Heckart. With the bowling alley being fully donated, revenue would go towards the debt service on the Aquatic Facility/Park Facilities. The RFQ will go out Summer 2024 for both facilities together and not to exceed \$8 Million and requires an Environmental Engineer on staff. Park Capital Improvement Budget each year is between \$500,000.00 to \$700,000.00 and without Memory Lanes, every bit of that Budget would need to be put toward the Aquatic Facility which would take away from other Park projects. There isn't a land fee and the only facility costs are related to maintaining and operating it. The Park Board would budget \$200,000.00/year for the next 20 years for the debt service on the aquatic facility. One of the features would be a concession facility to serve both the bowling alley and pool and no alcohol will be served.

Councilman Robinson asked if Sutherlands has any responsibility in the condition of the property. Park Director Epple stated they do not. City Administrator Kelvin Shaw added that originally it was Railroad property which is the cause of the soil contamination. There are special covenants on the property which require the Environmental Engineer on the project. They will work out the plan and work with the Department of Natural Resources. If we need to go outside the restricted covenants, there are provisions for going back to the Railroad, with DNR approval, to release the covenants. The facility was originally projected for Summer 2025 but realistically will be more toward Summer 2026.

The quote from Foley Equipment, Inc. is for the purchase of a Grade Control for Asphalt Paver. Cost \$30,305.00.

Presentation: Fire Station Location Discussion

Fire Chief, Matt Irwin provided information and updates regarding options on Fire Station location and Washington Street Bridge.

Fire Station Options:

Option 1 – Move forward with Central Fire in current location (recommended if unable to fund 3-station model): Pros no additional staffing costs, no additional apparatus costs, single station construction cost (\$5 Million), no land acquisition cost, quality coverage while allowing for growth. Cons potential need to reroute responses North due to train traffic, portions of South, Southwest, West, North and Airport outside 4 minutes response times, could be mitigated with additional bridge. Staffing includes 6 new personnel in grant/budget, Headquarters; 3-person engine, 2-person ladder, 2-person squads; Central Station – 3-person engine, 2-person squad.

Option 2 – Move forward with 2-station model with new station constructed north (Not recommended based on data); <u>Pros</u> no additional staffing costs, no additional apparatus costs, single station construction cost (\$5 Million), improved response times to Northern portion of Community, Reduction in potential issue with North side response due to train traffic. <u>Cons</u> potential land acquisition, potential need for to reroute responses South if train present, increased response time South and East Station and Apparatus still responsible for calls East of Grand.

Option 3 – 3-station model with new stations constructed North and Southeast (Recommended and preferred if funding available); Pros improved response times to all community areas, reduces issues responding to all community areas due to train traffic, additional personnel, reduces potential catastrophic loss of all stations & equipment in natural disaster. Cons potential for multiple land acquisition costs, additional apparatus (\$1 Million), Dual station construction costs (\$10 Million), ongoing operational costs. Staffing (need for 12 additional staff) – shifts would increase from 13 to 17, personnel minimum staffing increased from 10 to 13, estimated cost \$850,000.00 (increases annually).

- Option A: <u>Headquarters</u>- 3-person engine, 2-person ladder; <u>North</u> 4-person engine; <u>South</u> 4-person engine.
- Option B: <u>Headquarters</u>- 3-person engine, 2-person ladder; <u>North</u> 3-person engine, 2-person squad; <u>South</u> – 3-person engine.
- Option C: <u>Headquarters</u>- 3-person engine, 2-person ladder; <u>North</u> 3-person engine, 2-person squad;
 <u>South</u> 3-person engine, 2-person squad. Would require hiring 18 personnel at a cost of \$1,275,000.00/year.

Option 4 – Use Pettis County Fire Protection District Station 7: <u>Pros</u> Facility already in place to house apparatus, allows more time to weigh options on bridge and third station options. <u>Cons</u> resides outside city limits, delays response to calls south and southeast, still need living quarters (\$80,000.00), power/water/sewer hook-ups, rental fee (electric), fire hydrant installation, County retains all improvements including living quarters.

Fire Chief Irwin stated that in the event of a train blocking rail crossings, crew from Central Station respond and stage at the Dollar General Parking lot on North Ohio and remain until the train clears or a call for service. Headquarters Engine drops to a 3-person engine and deploys to Central. Truck 2 becomes a 3-person ladder and remains in quarters. The department is notified by SPD/Dispatch or Union Pacific that a train has stopped. Cameras to view crossings are on order and footage can be viewed at all fire stations and dispatch as well as SPD. The first camera should be installed in 4-6 weeks (Additional cameras ordered but looking at 5-6 month lead time).

Councilwoman Boggess thanked Fire Chief Irwin for all the work he put toward these options. She believes that the temporary fix of parking an Engine on the North side in the event of train traffic shows that we are working toward a solution. Fire Chief Irwin noted that it has been a team effort. They have received assistance from City Administrator Kelvin Shaw, Assistant City Administrator Matthew Wirt and City Engineer Chris Davies. Police Chief David Woolery has assisted in getting cameras for the Fire Department and asking officers to alert dispatch and SFD when they see a train coming through to implement response time.

City Administrator Shaw added that work has been going forward regarding the Washington Street bridge. The City has reached out to HDR to have structural engineers come to look at the bridge and pull together recommendations. The Railroad has been contacted and they are interested in an additional grade change crossing and may be able to offset some of the cost as well. Grant funds may also be available through the railroad and they could sign a letter of support to the Federal Railroad Administration like the Build Grant for the Railroad Spur.

- Staff has been working with Lagers on a plan to have them take over administration of the legacy firefighter pension plan. All current firefighters have been moved to Lagers. There are several steps to complete the process. Lagers has completed an initial actuarial valuation that needs to be formally acknowledged before other steps can be taken. Motion by Robinson, seconded by Oldham to acknowledge the report. All Present in Favor. Marshall was Absent.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS FROM MAYOR/COUNCIL/ADMINISTRATOR:

Councilman Oldham inquired about plans to return the money to the Lion's Club and other organizations due to the Failed bill related to painting of the City Logo on the water towers. It was a restricted donation so we will look at how to return the funds.

City Administrator Kelvin Shaw expressed his appreciation to John Kehde for his work on the Bothwell Regional Health Center Board.

City Administrator Kelvin Shaw addressed concerns on the following topics voiced by citizens during Good and Welfare at the April 15, 2024 Council Meeting:

- Impact Signs Development Agreement Council had discussion with developer to provide additional
 information; developer expressed appreciation to Council for discussing; concern was over
 \$50,000.00 fine if failed fire inspection was received over next 5 years; noted in discussion that
 there are no fines or claw backs for not meeting fire codes; all agreements with the City must be in
 writing; Council address any terms and decides in closed door; Council is working with developer.
- Responses to Good and Welfare included in agenda Along with City Administrator duties and
 preparing responses, cannot make deadline for packet distribution; will try to be brief in responses;
 always open to discuss any issue in detail with individuals.
- 3. Annexation Hearing for May 6 meeting Hearing occurred at the beginning of the current meeting.
- 4. North side fire response, County issues, Chief Building Official Information regarding lawsuit is inaccurate; lawsuit is about citizens safety such as not allowing fire pre-planning at jail; public records are on record and accessible through Casenet; taking steps to improve code enforcement including customer service training for staff; Fire station location options and bridge options given in Chief Irwin's presentation.
- 5. City Administrator notes for Windsor Review Copy of rough notes have been emailed.
- 6. Code Enforcement concerns not addressed unfortunate research wasn't satisfactory; there have been 6 other cases in 2300 to 2500 block of Dennis Road from 2021 to 2023; staff could've looked up utility records for the residence; staff is not being directed to be difficult; staff actively working on approach while encouraging compliance with building and property maintenance codes.
- 7. City making County to be bad guy not intent to demonize anyone; City was not quick to sue and came about after common understanding of law wasn't reached through discussion; Commission refused access to Sedalia Fire Department to allow pre-plan at any County building, particularly the jail; issue with downtown building inspection; Commissioners wouldn't allow entering the buildings.
- Strong armed by Code to get retail business license City can improve approach and demeanor in enforcing codes; taking steps to include customer service training.

GOOD & WELFARE:

David Goodson, 1640 Hedge Apple Drive, thanked Council and stated he received a letter from City Administrator Shaw outlining the agreement. He found it acceptable with 3 three minor changes: developer name change, clarification on permits and actual invoice from B & P Excavating was slightly higher than expected. He also inquired about rumblings that the City wants to annex Walnut Hills, Country Club, Country Club West and some houses from 32nd to Quisenberry. He asked that if there is serious discussion regarding this, it should be shared with the community.

Harry Hoffert, 1408 South Barrett, thanked Council for addressing some of the issues. He also commended Public Works for assisting him and his neighbor at 1409 with tree issues. His neighbor has

some really bad trees on the street side of the sidewalk and has reached out to have something done with the trees for 2 years. He inquired how to go about getting the trees taken care of.

Rachel Monahan, 24150 Oak Grove Lane, asked the City to consider extending the pickup time in school zones. Kids walking and individuals picking up students extends past the end time on the signs. Councilman Oldham stated that there is a program through the Sedalia Police Department and school officials to increase school and school zone safety. He recommended relaying a message to Police Chief David Woolery to share with that group.

Gary Lobaugh, 821 South Arlington, stated that the clarification on the Bowling Alley and Aquatic Center did not quell his concern. He is not reassured and does not believe due diligence was used in purchasing the property. Council is supposed to make decisions for the welfare of citizens. He added that the City needs to look at the overtime issues for Fire and Police Departments and they should be paid overtime in accordance with hours worked.

Dianne Simon, 17449 Brockman, Cole Camp, asked if there have been any changes or updates to the proposed Building Code Ordinances. Mayor Dawson offered to visit with her following the meeting.

CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION MAY 8, 2024

The City has an on-line broadcast of Council Meetings available both live and recorded by going to https://global.gotomeeting.com/join/578973061".

The Council of the City of Sedalia, Missouri duly met on Wednesday, May 8, 2024 at Noon at the Municipal Building in the Council Chambers with Mayor Andrew L. Dawson presiding. Council Members present were Jack Robinson, Thomas Oldham, Tina Boggess, Bob Hiller, Bob Cross, Rhiannon Foster and Steve Bloess (arrived at 12:40 p.m.). Chris Marshall was absent.

Presentation - Poposed Direction - Sewer Project (Burns & McDonnell & HDR

Representatives with Burns & McDonnell and HDR presented information regarding the proposed direction for treatment Plants.

The City of Sedalia has 3 wastewater treatment plants and each handles a different section of the city. The Southeast plant is not a concern. The focus is on the Central and North plants. 20% of flow to the Central plant is industrial, and the North plant is approximately 40% industrial. During wet weather events (2 ½ inch rain), each facility has a potential volume of up to 20 Million gallons. The North Plant has been given a compliance schedule to meet e-coli limits by 2029. Recently the City entered into an Abatement Order on Consent to achieve compliance at the North and Central Plants but no date is tied to the compliance time. This has given the City the ability to write a facility plan over the next year. Councilman Oldham asked about PFAS and any compliance schedule. Burns & McDonnell responded that currently there are no regulations on wastewater compliance for PFAS. They are working on compliance toward the drinking water side.

Central Plant – Discharges to Brushy Creek (history of impairment); Constructed in 1949, activated sludge facilities constructed in 2001, UV system added 2012; Rated capacity 3 MGD; Average daily flow 1.8 MGD; violated permit effluent limits 20 of 24 months in 2022-2023; Currently replacing aeration equipment to be completed December 2024. <u>Issues</u> – Screens, Aeration, Solids processing, Temporary Solids processing.

North Plant – Discharges to Pearl River (not impaired); Constructed in 1946, trickling filter facility constructed 1964; Rated capacity 2.5 MGD; Average daily flow 0.8 MGD; violated permit for 15 months and 6 quarters during 24-month span; must comply with disinfection and stricter ammonia criteria by April 1, 2029. <u>Issues</u> – Outdated technology, Equipment beyond repair, Upgrades can't comply with impending treatment requirements/limits, Facilities don't meet current codes and safety standards.

Improvement drivers for North and Central:

- Consistent Compliance to be in line with Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Agency.
- Equipment Reliability & Operations
- Future Discharge Limits looking at receiving streams to assess discharge water quality and future costs.
- Future Growth land space availability and property

- Affordability
- Safety

A feasibility study was completed with two alternatives: Consolidate at Central Plant and abandon North plant; New North Plant and Improve Central Plant. The only impediment for the location of the proposed new North Plant is the 100 and 500 Year Floodplain boundary. The site is 25 acres with 16 acres outside the floodplain. The Central Plant has Brushy Creek to the South; Railroad to the North; and East a property line. In the feasibility study it was discovered that building can take place in the footprint without disrupting the flood issue; fill in the lagoon to build a duplicate; and rebuild/replace stormwater overflow.

Affordability:

Alternative 1: Consolidate at Central Plant and Abandon North - Capital Costs: \$74-\$83 Million; Exceeds Budget; No remaining funds for Inflow and Infiltration.

Alternative 2: New North Plant and Improve Central Plant - Capital Costs: \$56-\$60 Million; Meets Budget; Potential Conserve funds for Inflow and Infiltration.

City Council expressed concerns regarding the change in direction related to the Bond issue that was passed. The feasibility study was ongoing at that time to identify risks and ensure proper direction and a few items did not fall into place. Without the discovery, issues would not have been identified that afford the best decision moving forward. Burns & McDonnell and HDR believe the best option is alternative 2 which will result in a cost savings to devote to Inflow and Infiltration. Feasibility Study results reflected major challenges in compliance at the Central Plant, Future Discharge Limitations, Future Growth and Affordability. From a site perspective, Central has a lot more obstacles adjacent to it and safety in either option would be approached similarly.

Systems are designed to handle some Inflow and Infiltration but not an excess. During the Master plan, flow monitoring was done which measures the volume coming into the sanitary sewer and showed where the bottlenecks are.

Inflow and Infiltration Program/Cost:

Phase I - \$5.4 Million; Years 1-4; Develop Program; Begin field work in priority Basin 1 to identify defects; develop Basin 1 targeted rehab repairs; Bid Basin 1 Rehab Plans/Begin rehab; Complete Basin 1 Rehab; Begin fieldwork Priority 2 Basin.

Phase 2 - \$5 - \$15 Million; Years 5-10; Verify Inflow and Infiltration percent reduction and cost effectiveness; Develop Basin Rehab plans in Basin 2; continue to identify, Rehab and verify results in Basin 2-6.

In looking at replacing the North Plant and addressing items at the Central Plant we have a good infrastructure but Wastewater Treatment takes its toll on equipment. The standard life span for equipment is 20-25 years. In working with DNR on the abatement order, the Facility Plan has to be submitted to the State within a year of signing the abatement order. The Facility Plan is statutory driven which means specific criteria have to be submitted to comply with the Plan. Burns & McDonnell are working with City staff and HDR to identify what the characteristics of the facility should be for designing. The rest of the process requires a minimum of 3 different treatment technology alternatives. In the 2019

permit, the North Plant must be offline by April 1, 2029 regardless of abatement order. City Administrator Kelvin Shaw stated there will be 2 Ordinances on the May 20, 2024 agenda for Council consideration: 1 with Burns & McDonnell to develop the Facility Plan; and 1 with HDR as Owners-agent Representative.

The Work Session adjourned at 1:15 p.m. on motion by Oldham, seconded by Robinson. All present in favor. Marshall was absent.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, APPROVING AND ANNEXING AN UNINCORPORATED AREA OWNED BY E.W. THOMPSON, INCORPORATED AND PETTIS COUNTY AMBULANCE, INCORPORATED INTO THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TO EXISTING CORPORATE LIMITS OF SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, it is reasonable and necessary to the proper development of the City of Sedalia, Missouri, and stating that the City of Sedalia, Missouri, has the ability to furnish normal municipal services to said area within a reasonable amount of time after annexation becomes effective; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2024, a petition was submitted to the City Council of Sedalia, Missouri, under the provisions of Section 71.012 RSMo. whereby E.W. Thompson, Incorporated and Pettis County Ambulance, Incorporated hereinafter described desires to have said real estate annexed into the corporate limits of the City of Sedalia, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sedalia, Missouri, held a public hearing on the 6th day of May, 2024, after having first given public notice of said public hearing by publication on April 27, 2024, in *The Sedalia Democrat*; and

WHEREAS, after considering and studying said request for annexation to the City of Sedalia, Missouri, and hearing evidence thereon, the City Council of the City of Sedalia, Missouri, does declare that said annexation is necessary for the reasonable and proper development of the City of Sedalia, Missouri, and that the City of Sedalia has the ability to furnish normal municipal services to said area within reasonable time after said annexation becomes effective and said area is contiguous to the existing corporate limits of the City of Sedalia, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, no written objections to said proposed annexation have been filed with the governing body of the City of Sedalia within fourteen (14) days after said public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, as follows:

Section 1. That under the provisions of Section 71.012 RSMo. the City Council of the City of Sedalia, Missouri, hereby declares that annexation of the land hereinafter described be and is necessary for the reasonable and proper development of the City of Sedalia, Missouri; that the City of Sedalia has the ability to furnish normal municipal service to said area within reasonable time after said annexation becomes effective; that said area is contiguous to the existing corporate limits of the City of Sedalia, Missouri; and should be a part of said City; said tract being a part of Pettis County, Missouri, is more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto.

Section 2. The entire tract shall be zoned C-3 General Business. The legal description is more particularly described on Exhibit A attached hereto.

Section 3. The City Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause three certified copies of this ordinance to be filed with the Office of County Clerk of Pettis County, Missouri, and placed on record with the Pettis County Recorder of Deeds.



Subject: Purchase of RFID System

During the yearly strategic budget presentation, the sanitation department presented the idea of moving to a volume-based system to provide customers more cost-effective choices to cart service. In addition, the sanitation department needed a system to track carts, monitor real time route data, improve customer billing, track pickup, and confirm cart owner information to insure customers are paying for the respective billed usage. The sanitation department identified the Rehrig Pacific Company during the purchase of the approximate 10,000 carts that were delivered with the RFID installed and as a provider of a quality tracking system for our needs. The system uses camera reading devices on the garbage trucks to identify the installed RFID in each cart. The camera reading system then associates the cart to the address and insures the proper billing based on the cart usage. If a cart is at the wrong address, is not set out properly, or is overfilled the system will document the problems and help sanitation operators resolve these issues. The sanitations supervisors will also be able to track route progress to reduce missed pickup and help improve customer relations.

The system was budgeted under the sanitation capital equipment budget in the amount of \$66,600 and under the capital software budget for \$22,800. Both items are at budget and procured under the Sourcewell contract utilizing the cooperative procurement process. Staff recommends acceptance of the contract.



Rehrig Pacific's RFID Reader

The Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader has simplified the use of RFID technology within the waste and recycling industry. Typical industry challenges such as down equipment/vehicles can cause the loss of valuable data due to the inflexibility of moving RFID systems from one truck to another. However, the Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader provides the flexibility our industry requires by being easily moved from one collection vehicle to another, or quickly installed on a spare vehicle. This flexibility allows our customers to always have an operating RFID system to capture valuable collection and GPS data for their programs when unexpected vehicle maintenance occurs. To date, Rehrig currently has 500+ RFID Readers actively deployed at 50+ customer locations.



The Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader incorporates all operating components such as a Patch Antenna (1 or 2 depending on application), GPS Module, and Cellular Modem all packaged into one easy to install solution.

Rehrig RFID Reader

Installation: Under Rehrig Pacific guidance, customer will provide all labor, tools and equipment required to install the RFID Reader onto their collection vehicles (unless otherwise agreed upon). Rehrig Pacific will provide the necessary mounting brackets and specifications for mounting the readers. Customer will utilize their mechanics to make a 12V power supply available in the area the reader will be mounted, as well as install the mounting brackets, any ancillary items (such as observation buttons, external GPS/GSM Antennas or sensors) and readers to the vehicles. Rehrig Pacific will provide all necessary parts and ancillary items required for this installation.

Performance: The Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader will be configured to read the UHF RFID tags on all containers targeted for data collection. Data collected will include the container ID being collected, the serial number, route, the date and time of the collection event, and the latitude and longitude of the truck at the time the container was collected. Equipment will also include LED lights and an annunciator (horn) that indicate the reader's status for troubleshooting purposes and to indicate when tags are read by the device in order to validate performance.



Data Management: The RFID readers are associated with the truck number in which they are installed. Throughout the collection day, the truck will capture container participation and will transmit collection data information via a cellular modem. Downloads of the RFID tag reads and other pertinent data transferred into the system allow for complete control of Customer's containers and collection operation. Installation: Under Rehrig Pacific guidance, customer will provide all labor, tools and equipment required to install the two-camera system and connect to the RFID Reader on your collection vehicles (unless otherwise agreed upon). Rehrig Pacific will provide the necessary mounting brackets and specifications for mounting the cameras. Cameras will connect to a central power junction box to be mounted in proximity of the RFID reader. The power junction box will plug directly into the RFID reader through a CAN connection. Any excess cabling after installation should be secured to protect from debris. Rehrig Pacific will provide all necessary parts and ancillary items required for this installation.

Performance: The Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader connected cameras will be configured to read the UHF RFID tags on all containers targeted for data collection and observation events triggered inside the cab of the vehicle. The image produced for the tip capture will include time stamp, reader number, and cart serial number, and account address. The image produced for observation events Data collected will include the container ID being collected, the serial number, route, the date and time of the collection event, and the latitude and longitude of the truck at the time the container was collected. Both cameras come equipped with 180-degree lens and protective housing.



Data Management: The Cameras will be capturing photos of tips and observations through the collection day. Observation photos will be automatically imported into Vision to be accessed through the Map Center. Customer Service/Support

Live Administrative and IT support will be available from 8AM – 5PM Central time. A Rehrig Technical Project Manager, Support Analyst, and Rehrig's Technical Support Portal will be accessible after project go-live. Access to open and closed work orders, collection data, and other program related reports are available 24/7 by logging onto the Vision website.

Service and Support

1. Phone Support for Software & Hardware - will be provided during normal business hours from 8 AM to 5 PM CST to answer any questions regarding the software and/or hardware. Customer Responsibilities

Customer must establish which individuals will be responsible for maintaining the truck hardware systems and data reporting daily. Rehrig Pacific will provide training, troubleshooting guides, and technical support to help these individuals carry out the responsibilities outlined below.

<u>Installation:</u> Customer will make the power supply available, mount brackets, and install Rehrig Pacific applicable hardware to Collection Vehicles.

Perform Daily Truck Systems Checks:

- Establish a standard operating procedure that requires each truck operator to perform a daily system check on the hardware system on their truck to verify that the system powers up and will either (a) read an RFID tag before the truck goes out of the yard or (b) provide the necessary information that the device is engineered to provide before collection begins. We recommend that a couple of containers with RFID tags (if applicable) be kept in the yard so that operators can use them to perform these daily system checks.
- Daily driver checks include:
 - o Ensure "Beep" When Vehicle Turned On
 - o Ensure Blue & Yellow Light Are On
 - o Ensure Nothing is Above Annunciator Cap
 - o Ensure "Beep" When Can / Container Tipped
- Supervisors should be made responsible for making sure that truck operators follow through with their daily system
 checks and that truck operator's report any truck system issues to them before a truck leaves the yard.

Perform Daily Portal Checks:

- Establish a standard operating procedure for office personnel and/or supervisors to:
 - Log into Vision daily verify that each truck that was on a route that day, or the day before, successfully downloaded the data that it collected.
 - Notify personnel responsible for maintaining the trucks systems as to which truck(s) did not download data so that they can start the hardware trouble shooting process immediately.

<u>Customer Guarantee</u>: Any reader repairs or replacements necessary due to improper use, abuse, the lack of reasonable care and/or for readers outside of their warranty will be quoted and billed for accordingly.

Rehrig Pacific Hardware and Software Warranties

RFID Reader Warranty

- The warranty on the <u>Rehrig Pacific RFID Reader</u> provides for all parts repair or replacement costs for failures due to any defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service, to the original purchaser only, for a period of one (1) year commencing on the date of the delivery to the customer. Optional extended warranty coverage is available for purchase by the customer, at a price for each additional year of coverage. The price for additional years of warranty coverage will be determined based on the RFID systems and ancillary options chosen by the customer. These options will be outlined after the RFID systems have been specified for the specific application.
- The warranties on these devices will provide for all parts replacement costs associated with the repair or replacement of these devices at a Rehrig Pacific designated repair center.
- The customer is responsible for the cost associated with packing and shipping of any failed units to the designated repair center, the shipment address will be provided at time of reported failure.
- The turnaround time commitment for repair of these units under a warranty repair process is five (5) business days from the time of receipt of failed unit at the designated Rehrig repair center to time of shipment of repaired or replacement unit back to the customer.
- The customer will be responsible for removing the damaged/malfunctioning reader from the collection vehicle, properly packaging and shipping the device to the repair center. Once returned, the customer will be required to reinstall the device following the original installation specifications provided by Rehrig Pacific.
- This warranty does not cover damage that is the result of the improper use of the equipment, abuse, or the lack of reasonable care and maintenance of the unit.
- Any reader repairs or replacements necessary due to improper use, abuse, the lack of reasonable care and/or for readers outside of their warranty will be quoted and billed for accordingly.

Vision Software Service Warranty

Rehrig Pacific shall use reasonable efforts consistent with prevailing industry standards to maintain the Software Service in a manner which minimizes errors and interruptions in the Software Service and shall perform the Software Service, Implementation Services and Technical Support in a professional and workmanlike manner. The Software Service may be temporarily unavailable for scheduled maintenance or for unscheduled emergency maintenance, either by Rehrig Pacific or by third-party providers, or because of other causes beyond Rehrig Pacific's reasonable control, but the Company shall use reasonable efforts to provide advance notice in writing or by e-mail of any scheduled service disruption.

Premium Homes LLC is requesting connection to the City's water distribution system and have agreed to pay the "out of City limits" rates until such time as the property is annexed into the City.

The agreement is written to allow the City to disconnect the water line should Premium Homes LLC not complete the annexation process. Premium Homes LLC has already signed and have notarized the agreement.

ANNEXATION AND UTILITY SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") entered into this_	10th day of MON 2024
between the City of Sedalia, Missouri, (hereinafter "City") a	and Premium Homes LLC (hereinafter
"Owner").	and the state of t

RECITALS:

1. Whereas, Owner represents that they are the owner of the following real estate (hereinafter referred as "Owner real estate") located in Pettis County, Missouri:

See attached "Exhibit A" as legal description of property and "Exhibit B" for location of property.

- 2. Whereas. Owner desires to connect Owner's property to the City's water system for purposes of developing Owner's property; and
- Whereas, City desires to permit Owner to connect to the City's water system for purposes of developing Owner's property; and
- Whereas, City desires the right to annex Owner' property if Owner' property becomes contiguous to City's corporate city limits; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above-recitals as well as the terms and conditions hereafter, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Owner, in exchange for the City's agreement to allow Owner to connect its property to the City's water system, the Owner, on behalf of themselves, its successors, heirs and assigns, hereby conveys unto the City the irrevocable and perpetual right to file on its behalf a Petition of Annexation at any time after annexation becomes possible.
- 2. City shall allow Owner to connect a water line serving Owner's property to the City's water system, and Owner shall make connection at its expense. Prior to approving the physical connection, Owner shall obtain all necessary easements, if needed, from any other landowner and provide recorded copies to the City, obtain permits for the connection and pay all fees required to connect to the City's water system. City shall provide and install water meter and box for connection of Owner's water service line. Owner shall be responsible for connecting the Owner's water service line from the house to the meter. Owner shall become a utility customer of the City and shall pay all fees and charges established by the City for water service.
- 3. The Owner shall ensure the water service line serving Owner's property is constructed in compliance with City regulations and standards. Construction of the water service line shall be

inspected by the City as though the property were within the City limits and shall be subject to City approval. Owner agrees to bring the new water service line to the City's meter and make connection. Owner shall not be charged for water service until the activation of service with the City of Sedalia.

- 4. Owner agrees to the "out of city limits" fee/cost schedule for services until such time as the Owner's property is annexed into the City of Sedalia.
- 5. Water service lines serving property other than the Owner's property shall not be connected to the line serving the Owner's property without the City's written consent.
- 6. To the extent allowed by law, the City may annex Owner's property into the City, without further action of the Owner, after Owner's property becomes contiguous to the corporate limits of the City.
- 7. Owner irrevocably appoints the City Administrator of Sedalia, Missouri, as its attorney-in-fact for the sole purpose of presenting a verified petition requesting annexation of Owner's property to the City Council of Sedalia, Missouri, IF AND WHEN the property becomes contiguous and compact to the city limits of the City of Sedalia, Missouri. The City Administrator may exercise this power of attorney at any time after Owner' property becomes contiguous to the corporate limits of the City. Owner on its behalf, and on behalf of its heirs, successors and assigns does hereby waive any notice of the filing of the petition, does hereby consent to the granting of the petition, and does hereby waive any objections, statutory or otherwise, to the annexation of the property into the City of Sedalia. The owner hereby authorizes the City to take whatever action necessary to complete the annexation of this property. Owner's consent to such future annexation of the Property is irrevocable.
- 8. The parties hereto agree that this Agreement shall be recorded, in the real estate records of the Office of Recorder of Deeds of Pettis County, Missouri, and that the obligations and conditions of this Agreement shall run with the Property and shall be binding upon all future owners and users of the Property. Owner, on its own behalf and on behalf of all such future owners of the Property hereby agrees that each purchaser, assignee or transferee of an interest in the Property, or any portion thereof, will be obligated and bound by the terms of this Agreement. Owner, on its own behalf and on behalf of all future owners of the Property, acknowledges that they and /or future owners of the Property shall be responsible for payment of all properly billed fees for water service as established by the City of Sedalia. Owner's liability contained in this paragraph 8 shall terminate when Owner has transferred its ownership interest in Owner's property to a successor owner, at which time, the successor owner shall be responsible for payment of all properly billed fees for water service as established by the City of Sedalia.
- 9. Alternatively, if requested by the City Administrator, Owner, its successors, assigns and heirs shall, within such time as specified by the City Administrator, submit a verified petition requesting annexation of the Owner' property to the City Clerk for presentation to the City Council of Sedalia, Missouri. The City Administrator may request Owner to present an annexation petition at any time after Owner's property becomes contiguous to the corporate limits of the City. The provisions of this paragraph shall be enforceable by specific performance.
- Owner shall give a copy of this Agreement to the person or persons who buy the Owner's property.
- 11. If Owner fails to comply with any of the provisions of this Agreement, or repudiate the

terms of this Agreement, City may terminate water service to Owner's property and disconnect the utility lines serving Owner's property from the City's water system. City shall give Owner six months prior written notice of its intent to terminate service.

- 12. This Agreement is not intended to confer any rights or remedies on any person other than the parties.
- 13. The benefits and burdens of this Agreement are intended to attach to and run with the land and shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties and its respective legal representatives, successors, heirs and assigns. All persons claiming under the parties shall conform to and observe the provisions of this Agreement.
- 14. This Agreement shall be recorded in the office of the Pettis County Recorder of Deeds at the City's expense.

SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR INSTALLING STOP SIGNS ON W. 7TH

AVENUE (EAST AND WEST BOUND) AT THE

INTERSECTION WITH BEACON.

Background:

The City of Sedalia received a request from a citizen to install STOP signs at the intersection of W. 7th and Beacon; with the signs being placed on W. 7th stopping both east and west bound traffic. This is the second time the City has review this intersection; the last time was in October of 2022.

Discussion:

City staff conducted two separate traffic counts at the intersection of W. 7th and Beacon. The first was conducted from 3/18/24 thru 3/24/24, which occurred while school was not in session. The second was conducted from 4/8/24 thru 4/14/24, which occurred while school was in session. Traffic on Beacon increased by about 500 vehicles per week; however if you review the daily count the volume of traffic on Beacon increased by approximately 80 vehicles per day verses school day and non-school day.

The most significant piece of data is that over 95% of all vehicles are within the 85 percentile of the posted speed limit; and it is not dependent on if school is in or out of session; if fact when school is in session there is better compliance with the posted speed limit (83.4%) verses when not in school (75.4%).

In reviewing crash data, at this intersection over the past 5 years there is only one recorded accident.


The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devises (MUTCD) has the following recommendations with respect to installing Multiway STOP signs:

1. A crash problem – as indicated by 5 or more reported crashes in a 12-month period – The City has only 1 reported crash in the last 5 years.

- The vehicular volume entering the intersection from the major street approaches (Total
 of both approaches) averages 300 vehicles per hour for any 8 hour period The counts
 show a maximum count of 702 vehicles for a 24 hour period, while school is in session
- 3. The total volume entering the intersection from the minor street (both approaches) averages at least 200 units per hour for the same 8 hours The counts show a maximum count of 255 vehicles for the same 24-hour period, while school is in session.
- 4. The 85th-percentile approach speed of the major-street traffic exceeds 40 mph The speed counts show that 85% of the vehicles are at or below 27 mph

Recommendation:

City staff DOES NOT recommend approval of the two STOP signs and recommends denial of the request.
