<u>Finance/Administration</u> – There are no items for consideration through the Finance/Administration Committee.

<u>Public Works Committee</u> – There is one item for consideration through the Public Works Committee.

1. The Utilities Department requests approval to purchase UV system supplies for the Central and Southeast Wastewater Treatment Plants in the amount of \$64,814.20 from Trojan Technologies. These components, including bulbs, sleeves, ballasts, and light sensor kits, are required to meet the disinfection standards outlined in the City's DNR NPDES permit for E. coli treatment during the April to October operational season. OEM parts from Trojan are necessary to maintain the system's performance guarantee and therefore meets the City purchasing policy as a sole source vendor. This expenditure was anticipated and included in the FY26 budget and is slightly below the original budgeted amount. Staff recommends proceeding with the purchase to ensure uninterrupted regulatory compliance and continued system reliability.

<u>Public Safety Committee</u> – There are two items for consideration through the Public Safety Committee.

- 1. During the strategic plan presentation in 2024, the operational need for a Special Response Vehicle (SRV) to enhance officer safety during dynamic entries and life-threatening incidents was outlined. Currently, the Police Department lacks this critical capability, placing officers at increased risk during high-threat situations. This need was further discussed during the FY 2026 budget planning sessions, and the approved budget included funding for the acquisition of an SRV. Following the budget adoption, SPD solicited bids for the vehicle and received one bid proposal from Terradyne Armored Vehicles, Inc. The proposed vehicle meets all operational requirements and was the department's preferred choice due to its level of protection and suitability for use by the Special Response Team. The total cost of the vehicle is \$299,950, with an additional \$7,980 in transportation costs, bringing the total to \$307,930. Although the original budgeted amount was \$275,000, inflation and market conditions have contributed to the increased cost. The department, however, has maintained restricted safety equipment funds in the amount of \$50,000, which will be applied toward the purchase. Staff recommends acceptance of the bid from Terradyne Armored Vehicles, Inc. for the purchase of the Special Response Vehicle. This acquisition was budgeted in FY 2026 and will significantly enhance officer safety and departmental response capabilities.
- In response to ongoing complaints from residents, including concerns brought forward to Councilman Scribner regarding excessive noise on Broadway Boulevard, an ordinance has

been drafted to prohibit the use of unmuffled engine braking systems ("Jake Brakes") within the city limits. A similar ordinance previously existed but was later repealed due to problematic language; however, this updated version corrects those issues and incorporates
language recommended by the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). The ordinance prohibits engine braking without a properly maintained muffler, except in emergency situations to protect life or property, or when used by city, state, or rescue vehicles.
The prohibition applies to all roads within the City of Sedalia. Signs stating "VEHICLE NOISE
LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" may be installed at locations deemed appropriate by the City Council, though signage on state highways would require MoDOT approval.

<u>Community Development Committee</u> – There is one item for consideration through the Community Development Committee.

1. First there will be a presentation by Sedalia Community Helping Hands about their organization and the work they do in Sedalia. Sedalia Community Helping Hands is a volunteer-led nonprofit organization that provides essential home improvements for low-income, elderly, and disabled residents, directly supporting neighborhood revitalization and public welfare. The organization's work enhances public health and safety by making critical house repairs and addressing debris and nuisance conditions that could otherwise strain City enforcement resources. To help continue these efforts, staff and the mayor are proposing two resolutions to provide targeted support within the designated 353 Redevelopment Area. The first resolution authorizes the waiver of up to \$600 in City-imposed container rental and landfill tipping fees during Fiscal Year 2025-2026. This waiver supports cleanup and abatement projects assisting vulnerable residents with property maintenance and compliance. To qualify, projects must occur within the designated redevelopment area, and all container requests must be submitted at least one week in advance. The second resolution authorizes the waiver of building permit fees up to \$4,000 for eligible projects during the 2025 and 2026 calendar years, with the resolution taking effect immediately upon passage and remaining valid through April 6, 2026. Staff recommends approval of both resolutions and requests that all relevant departments coordinate with Sedalia Community Helping Hands to implement the waiver

programs and ensure oversight for code compliance and accurate project tracking.

ROLL CALL OF STANDING COMMITTEES:

Financial Update: Finance Director Jessica Pyle stated that Sales and Use Taxes are up Fiscal Year to Date \$1,000,000.00 or 5.4% over last Fiscal Year to Date. An increase of 4% was budgeted and the City is over Budget \$264,000.00. The Marijuana tax collection began in October 2023. Marijuana Taxes represent two months of reporting in the last fiscal year. Franchise tax includes the April 2023 Charter settlement for streaming class action suit for which the City received \$377,818.00 and it is the primary reason for the difference between this Fiscal year and last. The remaining \$200,000.00 decrease is related to the natural gas tax at a decrease of 25.5%. Transportation taxes are higher fiscal year to date as a result of increase Gas Tax of 9.9% Fiscal Year to date. And a vehicle sales tax increase of 4.3% with

vehicle sales remaining flat. Property Tax payments collected over the prior Fiscal Year were \$170,000 more and the majority are received in December and January. Director Pyle stated that for Current Fiscal year there is one month to report for February sales and they are up Fiscal Year to Date over \$58,000.00 or 3.8% which is slightly below budget of 4% by \$3,000.00.

- Motion by Oldham, seconded by Foster to approve a records destruction request from the Finance Department. All Present in Favor. Robinson was Absent.
- The proposed ordinance establishes guidelines for public participation at City of Sedalia meetings to enhance structure, ensure safety, and support orderly conduct of city business. By designating meetings as limited public forums, it reinforces the importance of respectful and relevant dialogue while still encouraging public involvement. The ordinance also provides a designated free-speech zone for political expression, outlines expectations for public comment, and ensures that disruptions are handled fairly.

This ordinance authorizes the purchase of a Kubota SVL65 skid steer and bucket from Crown Power & Equipment Co. through the Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing contract #112624-KBA. The purchase price of \$61,320.73 includes a discount of \$18,923.52.

The Water Department identified the need for a compact excavator to assist with small-scale water line repairs and maintenance. This request proposes the purchase of a Kubota KX018-4 mini excavator and two buckets from Crown Power & Equipment Co. The purchase will be made through the Sourcewell Cooperative Purchasing contract and includes a discount of \$9,747.36. The final cost to the City is \$32,164.64.

The Street Department is requesting approval to purchase a 36-foot, 40,000 lb. gooseneck trailer to transport heavy equipment to job sites. Truck Country in Versailles, Missouri, quoted a price of \$43,024.40 through utilization of the Missouri BUYS cooperative procurement program.

BILL NO. 2025-78, ORDINANCE NO. 12261 – AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND ACCEPTING A QUOTE FOR THE PURCHASE OF A GOOSENECK TRAILER FOR THE STREET DEPARTMENT was read once by title. 2nd Reading – Motion by Oldham, 2nd by Foster. All Present in Favor. Robinson was Absent. Final Passage – Motion by Foster, 2nd by Oldham. All Present in Favor. Robinson was Absent. Staff applied for and received a grant from the Missouri Division of Tourism to fund wayfinding signage throughout Sedalia. As part of the implementation process, the project was put out for bid. Two bids were submitted, however, both were deemed non-compliant. One bidder failed to acknowledge the required addendums, both used incorrect bid forms, and neither signed and dated the IFB signature page as required. Following consultation with the granting agency and the Sedalia Convention & Visitors Bureau, it was determined that there was not sufficient time remaining in the

current grant cycle to rebid and complete the project successfully. The City was subsequently authorized to reapply for the grant in the next state fiscal year which provides a full grant window from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026. The City has since been notified that it has been reawarded the grant and can move forward with the project with a new bidding process. Staff recommends that Council formally reject all bids received related to the fabrication and installation of wayfinding signage. The project will be rebid under the new grant cycle, allowing adequate time for competitive bidding and project completion. Motion by Oldham, seconded by Marshall to formally reject Wayfinding bids. All Present in Favor. Robinson was Absent.

The City Council was presented with a proposal to fund roadway and sidewalk rehabilitation along Mill Street, North of 3rd Street. This area is part of a broader redevelopment effort at 521 East 3rd Street by Holland Holding Company, LLC, which is revitalizing a portion of a formerly underutilized property. To support this redevelopment, which includes the Boys & Girls Club of West Central Missouri, future residential apartments, and additional non-profit service facilities, staff recommends approval of an Infrastructure Development Agreement with Holland Holding Company, LLC. Under the terms of the agreement, the Developer will construct stormwater improvements, sidewalks, curbs, and install street lighting along the South and West edges of the project site. These improvements will extend the downtown streetscape and address long-standing drainage issues along Mill Street. The City will reimburse the Developer for up to \$525,000 in certified infrastructure construction costs, amortized over ten years. The City will directly provide the materials and labor for paving Mill Street and supply the light fixtures, which will be installed by the Developer.

During the strategic plan presentation in 2024, the operational need for a Special Response Vehicle (SRV) to enhance officer safety during dynamic entries and life-threatening incidents was outlined. Currently, the Police Department lacks this critical capability, placing officers at increased risk during high-threat situations. This need was further discussed during the FY 2026 budget planning sessions, and the approved budget included funding for the acquisition of an SRV. Following the budget adoption, SPD solicited bids for the vehicle and received one bid proposal from Terradyne Armored Vehicles, Inc. The proposed vehicle meets all operational requirements and was the department's preferred choice due to its level of protection and suitability for use by the Special Response Team. The total cost of the vehicle is \$299,950, with an additional \$7,980 in transportation costs, bringing the total to \$307,930. Although the original budgeted amount was \$275,000, inflation and market conditions have contributed to the increased cost. The department, however, has maintained restricted safety equipment funds in the amount of \$50,000, which will be applied toward the purchase. I respectfully recommend acceptance of the bid from Terradyne Armored Vehicles, Inc. for the purchase of the Special Response Vehicle. This acquisition was budgeted in FY 2026 and will significantly enhance officer safety and departmental response capabilities.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA AMENDING THE CITY CODE REGARDING PROHIBITED JAKE BRAKING.

WHEREAS, the Sedalia City Council, in response to numerous citizen complaints about excessive noise from the practice of "Jake Braking" on city roads, desires to prohibit that practice.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

Section 58-22 "Jake Braking Prohibited"

- A. Definitions. The following words, terms, and phrases, when used in this Section, shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:
 - **ENGINE RETARDING BRAKE** A "Dynamic Brake," "Jake Brake," "Jacobs Brake," "C-Brake," "Paccar Brake," transmission brake, or any other engine retarding brake system that alters the normal compression of the engine and subsequently releases that compression.
- B. Prohibitions. Engine compression braking devices on any commercial vehicle, as defined in Missouri Revised Statute RSMo Section 301.010, may only be used within the city limits of Sedalia, Missouri if the truck is equipped with an adequate muffler (factory muffler or equivalent aftermarket muffler) which is properly maintained to prevent any excessive or unusual noise. If the truck's exhaust system is equipped with a muffler cut-off, bypass, or similar device, that device shall not be activated when the engine brake is being utilized. Unmuffled engine braking system shall only be utilized within the city limits by commercial motor vehicles in emergency situations to protect life or property. Engine braking systems on rescue vehicles, city and state vehicles are exempt from this ordnance if used in the performance of official duties.
- C. Areas of Prohibition. The prohibition set forth herein shall apply to all of the public roads and highways in the City of Sedalia.
- D. Signage. Signs stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" may be installed at locations deemed appropriate by the Sedalia City Council to advise motorists of the prohibitions contained in this Section,

except that no sign stating "VEHICLE NOISE LAWS ENFORCED" or "ENGINE BRAKE ORDINANCE ENFORCED" shall be installed on State Highways without a permit from the Missouri Department of Transportation. The provisions of this Section shall be in full force and effect even if no signs are installed.

E. Enforcement. Any person who is convicted of a violation of this Section shall be fined up to five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and/or up to ninety (90) days in jail for each such violation.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: The provisions of any ordinance or code section in conflict with any provision of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect following final passage and approval.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: The provisions of this ordinance are severable and if any provision hereof is declared invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable, such determination shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this ordinance.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE WAIVER OF CONTAINER RENTAL AND LANDFILL FEES FOR SEDALIA COMMUNITY HELPING HANDS DURING FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026.

WHEREAS, Sedalia Community Helping Hands is a recognized charitable organization dedicated to improving the living conditions of low-income families in Sedalia through home repair and renovation; and

WHEREAS, these projects not only enhance the living standards of underprivileged residents but also contribute to the overall wellbeing and aesthetic improvement of our community; and

WHEREAS, these projects, including those aiding elderly residents, not only enhance the living standards of underprivileged residents but also contribute to the overall wellbeing and aesthetic improvement of our community; and

WHEREAS, the organization follows a structured and responsible process to identify and assist residents who are elderly, disabled, or financially unable to bring their properties into compliance without external support; and

WHEREAS, the work performed by Sedalia Community Helping Hands contributes directly to public health, safety, and neighborhood revitalization by removing accumulated waste, debris, and other public nuisances which, if left unaddressed, constitute blight and can attract vermin, depress property values, and strain City enforcement resources; and

WHEREAS, failure to partner with volunteer organizations such as *Sedalia Community Helping Hands* would place the entire burden of abatement costs solely upon the City of Sedalia, and by extension, the taxpayers and ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sedalia desires to support these volunteer-led abatement effmis through a limited waiver of fees, thereby enhancing community engagement while protecting the public interest.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Council hereby authorizes the waiver of City-imposed container rental and landfill tipping fees for Sedalia Community Helping Hands in an amount not to exceed Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) for the fiscal year 2025-2026.

<u>Section 2</u>. This waiver shall only apply to cleanup projects located within the City's 353 Redevelopment Area, previously declared blighted by the City Council, where public funds and resources may be used to support voluntary abatement effmis. Projects outside this area shall not be eligible for the fee waiver.

<u>Section 3.</u> Said waiver shall only apply to costs incurred through the City of Sedalia for the disposal of materials resulting from qualified volunteer efforts conducted by Sedalia Community Helping Hands within the corporate limits of the City of Sedalia.

<u>Section 4</u>. All requests for containers shall be made by contacting the Public Works Department at 660-826-3357 and must be submitted no less than one (1) week prior to the intended use.

<u>Section 5</u>. The Public Works Department and Code Enforcement Division shall maintain documentation of all fee-exempted services provided under this Resolution and rep01t such usage to the Finance Department for internal accounting.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, WAIVING PERMIT FEES FOR SEDALIA COMMUNITY HELPING HANDS FOR PROJECTS LOCATED WITHIN THE 353 REDEVELOPMENT AREA.

WHEREAS, Sedalia Community Helping Hands is a recognized charitable and volunteer- driven organization committed to improving the living conditions of low-income, elderly, and disabled residents in the City of Sedalia through essential home repair and renovation; and

WHEREAS, these projects not only enhance the individual living conditions of underresourced residents but also contribute to public health, neighborhood revitalization, and the overall wellbeing of the community; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously declared the 353 Redevelopment Area as blighted, thus authorizing the lawful use of public funds and resources for the abatement of such blight; and

WHEREAS, failure to pminer with organizations such as Sedalia Community Helping Hands would place the entire burden of addressing these conditions on the City and, by extension, on Sedalia taxpayers and ratepayers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that supprising volunteer efforts within the 353 Redevelopment Area through fee waivers promotes community welfare, equitable redevelopment, and responsible stewardship of public resources.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SEDALIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Permit Fee Waiver.

It is in the public's general interest to waive the permit fees.

- a) The City of Sedalia hereby authorizes the waiver of building permit fees in an amount not to exceed Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) for projects undertaken by Sedalia Community Helping Hands during the calendar years 2025 and 2026.
- b) This waiver shall apply only to projects located within the boundaries of the 353Redevelopment Area, as previously designated by the City Council.
- c) Eligible fees may include but are not limited to: construction, renovation, and repair permits required for residential projects within the qualifying area.

Section 2. Public SafetyOversight.

It is deemed an appropriate use of City resources to conduct plan reviews and followup inspections necessary to ensure code compliance and public safety for these volunteer-led projects without remuneration.

Section 3. Departmental Coordination.

City staff, including the Community Development Department, Building Official, and other relevant offices, are directed to work collaboratively with Sedalia Community Helping Hands to implement this Resolution and to ensure transparent and accountable tracking of eligible fee waivers.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and shall remain in effect until **April 6th**, **2026**, unless otherwise amended by action of the City Council.
