Sedalia Public Works Trained on New Eco-Friendly Street Maintenance Equipment



The City of Sedalia is excited to announce that the Public Works Department successfully completed training on its newly acquired VSS Slurry Seal Macro Paver, an eco-conscious investment designed to improve the quality, durability, and efficiency of the City's street maintenance program.

The last week of August, Public Works Operations Director, Justin Bray and members of the crew put their training into practice at Crown Hill Cemetery, where they applied slurry seal treatments using the new equipment in a controlled setting. The cemetery was selected as an ideal location to refine operations with minimal impact on traffic.

The Macro Paver applied a cold-mix asphalt emulsion called slurry seal – a blend of asphalt emulsion, aggregate, water, and additives – that formed a protective surface coat for aging roads. The process filled minor cracks, restored surface texture, and helped extend pavement life without requiring a full mill-and-overlay.

One of the key advantages of the equipment was its rapid curing time. Under typical weather conditions, slurry seal applications made with the Macro Paver supported light traffic within about an hour of placement, reducing disruption for residents and businesses.

"We were excited to bring this new technology to Sedalia," said City Administrator Matthew Wirt. "It represented a more sustainable, cost-effective way to protect our roadways and stretch taxpayer dollars further – all while reducing our environmental footprint."

Unlike traditional asphalt methods that required high-heat applications, slurry seal was a cold mix process, which consumed less energy and produced fewer emissions. The VSS Macro Paver also ensured uniform distribution and consistent surface quality, improving both safety and appearance.

The public could expect to see this new machine in action throughout the community in the near future.
