April is Autism Awareness month. What is autism? According to the website autismspeaks.org, "Autism or autism spectrum disorder (ASD) refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication."

According to the CDC website 1 in 44 children have been identified with ASD. It occurs in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups. ASD is 4 times more common in boys than girls.

Autism Speaks says that recreational activities are very important for people with autism, because activities provide the opportunity for increased self-confidence for your child.

Find out what your child enjoys within the context of their skills and interest and then give them the opportunity to try multiple activities for a period of time.

You can find some sensory friendly events at our Sedalia Parks & Rec website.

The Heckart Community Center offers a Sensory Friendly Play time on Wednesdays from 11:30 a.m. – 1:30 p.m. (adult must be present). During this playtime children and families with varying abilities will be given the opportunity to enjoy play time in a sensory friendly and safe environment! Arbor Day Celebrated

The City of Sedalia's Tree Board hosted a 2-day event to celebrate Arbor Day.

The first day, Friday, April 7th began with a forest walk with Jess Thenhaus, a trained Forest and Nature Therapy guide, at Bothwell Lodge State Park at 2:00 p.m. followed by a 4:00 p.m. tree planting service at Liberty Park with Mayor Andrew Dawson reading and signing an Arbor Day proclamation.

Saturday, April 8th featured 2 more walks with Ms. Thenhaus both at Bothwell Lodge State Park, one at 9:00 a.m. and one at 11:00 a.m.

Sedalia is proud of its participation in the Tree City USA Program. This year marks the City's fourteenth year of designation as a Tree City USA.



The four standards for accomplishing Tree City USA recognition is for the community to have a Tree Board, adoption of a Tree Care Ordinance, a community forestry program of at least \$2 per capita, and a proclamation and observation of Arbor Day.
